Program Information:

This program provides students an opportunity to study upper level French in Paris, France for three weeks. The program will provide 6 credit hours, 3 hours in either FREN 313 or FREN 314 (French Conversation and Composition), 3 hours in FREN 370 (Studies in French Film and Literature), or FREN 390 (Special Topics: A History of Paris and its Architecture). All students will take FREN 390 and choose one other course. Students will reside in a residence centrally located in Paris. The daily schedule while in Paris includes classes as well as visits to museums, sites, and other monuments inside and outside of Paris. Historic sites such as the Arc-de-Triomphe, Champs-élysées, the Sacré-Coeur, the Musée du Louvre, the Orsay Museum, etc.

This program involves walking for long periods of time on a daily basis.

The Program Fee of **\$4,495*** includes a non-refundable \$50 application fee, round-trip airfare, lodging, ground transportation, two meals a day (breakfast and dinner), medical insurance, and entrances into sites. **TUITION FOR THE COURSES IS NOT INCLUDED.**

Application deadline is **March 2, 2012.** Deposit of \$550 will be posted to the student's MyCharleston account once the application has been submitted to, and approved by, the CIE. Scholarships of up to \$1500 are available to CofC students who study abroad. Eligibility is based on demonstrated financial aid and academic merit.
